Notice the cart in front of the operator, it contains the cutting tools that were changed by hand. Tool change is automatic now , as quickly as 1.7 seconds. And the sawyer in the top right photo is cutting one piece of metal at a time.


We now have 19 vertical and horizontal CNC machining and tapping centers. Our saw department has four twin-headed CNC automatic saws, and a bundle cut saw that has cut up to 49 pieces at a time.

Fab Masters, Inc. Celebrated 11th Year In Business July 29



Our first knee mill is pictured here along with the first large Milltronics CNC machining center.


Notice the rotary fixture in the Milltronics-boy we thought this was the bees knees. This machining center is still in service.




Ron shows his appreciation to Ray Klein, and Charlie Hall of Extruded Aluminum Corp. for being our oldest customer.








Pumpkin steal 2008 Halloween party


Fab Masters Annual Golf Outing...
